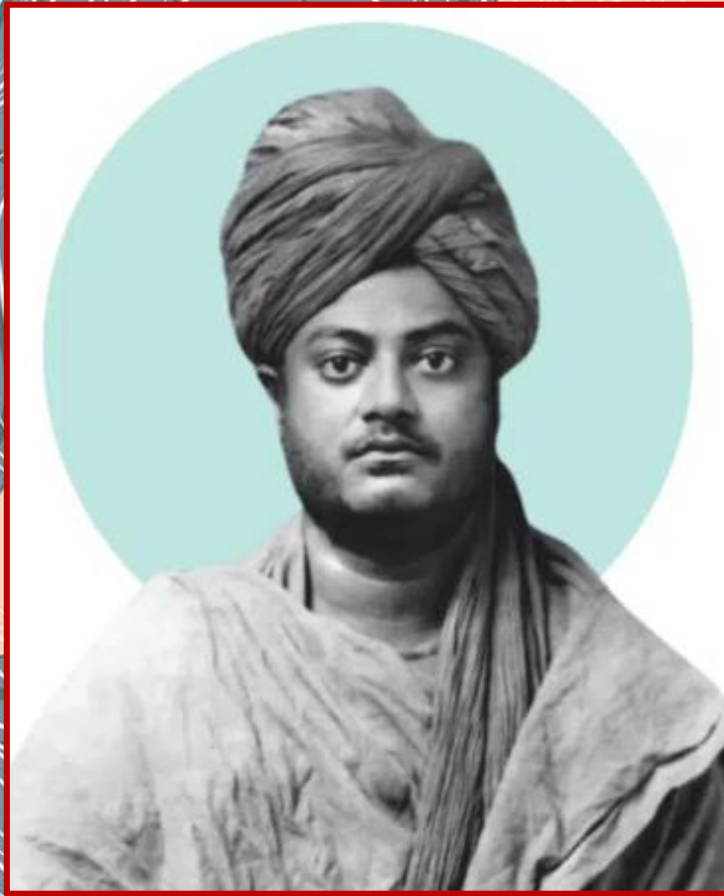

MESSAGE OF NATIONAL DIRECTOR FOR RSETIS, NACER

I am pleased to know about India's steady economic growth for the past many years. However, despite this growth, providing gainful employment to rural youth remains a significant challenge. The agricultural sector's stagnant employment potential and the mismatch between private sector growth and employment opportunities aggravate the issue. We are grateful that a well-coordinated professional effort to address this problem was made way back in 1982 by Poojya Dr. D Veerendra Heggade, Dharmadhikari of Dharmasthala in Karnataka in association with Syndicate Bank and Canara Bank to start Rural Development and Self Employment Training Institutes [RUDSETIs]. These institutions provide short-term training and long-term handholding to unemployed youth.



It is indeed noteworthy that the training methodology and the best practices followed by the RUDSETIs are quite unique and this has resulted in a settlement rate of over 70%. The training methodology and the best practices followed by RUDSET Institutes have been adopted by the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) and replicated the same in all the RSETIs. The initiatives of 25 sponsor Banks have resulted in establishment of 609 RSETIs, (including 27 RUDSETIs), as on 31.03.2025, covering 596 districts across the country providing gainful employment opportunities to many rural unemployed youths.

Employment opportunities in Government / Public Sector and Private sectors are not keeping pace with the growth in the number of youths seeking employment. However, the opportunities for Self-Employment, particularly in the Services Sector, are increasing manifold. But the unemployed youth are not properly oriented towards Self-Employment and are not able to engage themselves in any productive activity. This is where our 609 RSETIs/RUDSETIs play a proactive role and orient the unemployed youth towards entrepreneurship, by imparting the required training, and providing escort services to set up their own self-employment activities/ventures.

It is indeed a matter of pride that the RSETIs/RUDSETIs have cumulatively trained 55.53 lakh rural unemployed youth of which 40.27 lakh candidates have been settled up to 31.03.2025 i.e., above 73% settlement. The share of women candidates trained comes to above 70%. Further, the performance during FY 2024-25 is 6.21 lakh (101% achievement) in training, 4.54 lakh (73%) in settlement, and 2.54 Lakh (57%) in credit Linkage. Successful entrepreneurs have not only become self-employed but have also provided employment to a number of people in their ventures. It is noteworthy that RSETIs have played a major role in transforming the job seekers into job providers.

I am happy to note that your RSETI is bringing out the Annual Activity Report for FY 2024-25. I take this opportunity to extend my congratulations to the Director and Team members of the RSETI for their outstanding achievement in training, settlement, and Credit linkage. My gratitude to Poojya Dr. D. Veerendra Heggade, President NAR, Sri Pankaj Yadav, Joint Secretary (Skills), MoRD, Sri Santosh Kumar Tiwari, Director, MoRD, Sri. Bhavendra Kumar, Executive Director, Canara Bank, Sri M. Bhaskara Chakravarthy, General Manager, FI Wing, Canara Bank, and the SRLM officials for their unstinted support and guidance from time to time.

As we move forward, I envision RSETIs/RUDSETIs playing a vital role in orienting unemployed youth towards entrepreneurship, provide required training and enable them to set up their own ventures.

PREAMBLE

Swami Vivekananda visualised a regenerated India through blending of oriental spirituality with occidental science and technology. He said that the aim of education must be to solve the problems of life. In his view education is all round development of physical, intellectual, moral and spiritual values. His greatest contribution was to open the minds of individuals to their duty to the downtrodden masses. He fought to revive the spirit of humanism in education. In his view education is not identical with information. He said education should lay proper emphasis on creativity, originality and excellence. With this mission in mind “Ramakrishna Mission Samaj Sevak Sikshan Mandir” started its maiden journey in the year 1986 under the aegis of Ramakrishna Mission Saradapitha, a branch centre of Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, Howrah, West Bengal. In the same year the flagship programme of the institute – 10 month long free residential course viz. “Rural Entrepreneurship Development Programme (REDP)” was launched with the following objectives:

OBJECTIVES & CHARACTERISTICS

- ❖ To develop human resources in the rural India and to improve the socio-economic condition of its people through skill development and income generation.
- ❖ To upgrade the traditional knowledge and skill of the farmers and the rural artisans in the light of continuous research and development in the national and international level.
- ❖ To create scientific temperament amongst the rural folks and an eagerness to adopt new technology and innovation.
- ❖ To build character on the basis of higher truths of spirituality and value education as character building was fundamental in Swami Vivekananda's concept of education.
- ❖ To instil confidence and determination in the minds of trainees.
- ❖ Generate self-confidence & determination in the minds of trainees so that they can venture to float new enterprises for self-employment at their respective villages after completing the training.



IMPORTANT MOVEMENTS IN THE HISTORY OF THIS INSTITUTE

- ❖ In the year 2007-08 (17 March 2008) the institute entered into a tie-up arrangement with UBI (United Bank of India) and NABARD (National Bank for Agriculture & Rural Development) to function as a RUDSETI (Rural Development & Self Employment Training Institute) type institute for conducting various skill development training programmes on equal cost sharing basis.
- ❖ The RSETI in its new form continued with the REDP (Rural Entrepreneurship Development Programme), the flagship training programme of 10 months' duration. Subsequently, it introduced various SDI (Skill Development Initiative) programmes of short duration, aiming at skill development and income generation. These were mainly held at the sub-centres scattered over various districts of West Bengal. SDI programmes are generally non-residential and held on various trades in farm & non-farm sector sponsored by NABARD / Govt. of West Bengal / Govt. of India etc.

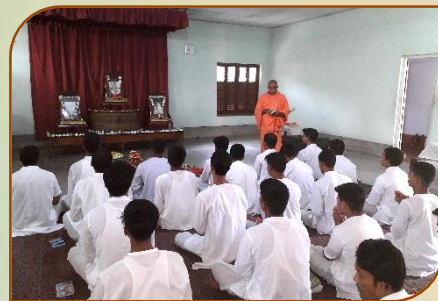


- ❖ During the course of its long journey some events of 2011-12 and 2012-13 deserves special mention. On the basis of its performance during 2011-12 the institute earned “A” grade and on the performance of 2012-13 ranked 3rd best RSETI amongst all the RSETIs in India by NAR (National Academy of RUDSETI) under the aegis of Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), Govt. of India. The Institute continues to enjoy “AA” grade status for the last several years.
- ❖ Revised Memorandum of Understanding was signed on November 13, 2023 at Kolkata between PNB Centenary Rural Development Trust (PNBCRD) and Ramakrishna Mission Samaj Sevak Sikshan Mandir (RKMSSSM) fixing the sharing of recurring training expenses in the ratio of 2:1 and also ultimate subsidy claim in the identical ratio of 2:1.



SALIENT FEATURES OF METHODOLOGY & MODULES

- ❖ Short duration courses (ranging from 80 hours to 480 hours) on various income generating trades
- ❖ EDP oriented training modules as per the norms set by NAR (National Academy of RUDSETI)
- ❖ Full-fledged infrastructural facilities arranged including demonstrative units of various trades
- ❖ EDP inputs as per course module given by NAR
- ❖ Starting the day with Prayer followed by Yoga class, Shramdan and presentation of MILLY (Most Important Lessons Learnt Yesterday) by the trainees
- ❖ Writing training log on day-to-day basis
- ❖ Preparation of Post Programme Report (Appendix 23) & Post Training Evaluation (Appendix 25)
- ❖ Guiding trainees on preparation of project report to avail bank loan after successful completion of the training



IMPROVISATION ADOPTED

- ❖ Training programmes and training schedules are drawn as per NAR's (National Academy of RUDSETI) course module
- ❖ Prescribed training kits are used in all skill training programmes
- ❖ Micro Lab - Ice breaking & rapport building exercises are done at the beginning of all training programmes to help the trainees know each other intimately
- ❖ AMT (Achievement Motivation Training) manual in Bengali version introduced & followed
- ❖ Inviting successful entrepreneurs for sharing of their experiences with the subsequent batches
- ❖ Introduction of Behavioural games to get insight into the individual psyche and to reveal among other things his attitudes & values
- ❖ Introduction of MIS based record keeping
- ❖ Maintenance of ex-trainees' database & improving the quality of follow-up action
- ❖ Maintenance of settlement register, training log, attendance register / imposing biometric attendance, visitor's books etc.



SPECIAL STATUS

The Department of Agriculture, Govt. of West Bengal has recognised Ramakrishna Mission Samaj Sevak Sikshan Mandir as a resource centre for training of Farmers' and is sponsoring different training programmes for the farmers hailing from different districts of the state.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The gradually built-up three-storied magnificent RSETI building named Vibekananda Bhavan covering approximately 10,000 Sq. ft. was formally inaugurated in the year 2011 coinciding with the Silver Jubilee Celebration of the institute. The RSETI is spread over vast area with beautiful garden & greenery. The surroundings provide an ideal environment for learning & concentration.

The building is having number of spacious class rooms, office room, staff room, principal's office & living room. This apart, there is dormitory for the trainees, guest rooms, meeting and counselling room, conference hall, computer lab, library etc. There is a number of toilet blocks and long widening corridors. At present residential training of more than 100 trainees can be organised simultaneously at the institute. The institute is thankful to the Dept. of Agriculture, Govt. of W.B for providing grant-assistance for construction of the new building under RKVY (Rastriya Krishi Vikash Yojana).

SOLAR POWER PLANT

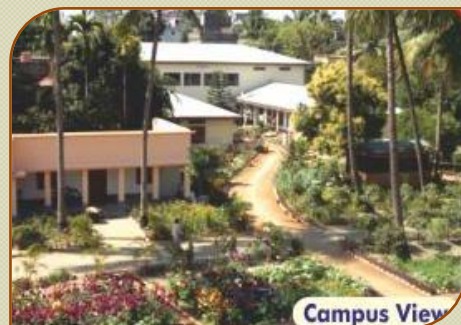
In the year 2021-22, West Bengal Infrastructural Development Finance Corporation Ltd. (WBIDFC Ltd.), Govt. of West Bengal has donated necessary funds for installation of On-Grid Roof Top Solar Power Plant (20 KW) under their CSR scheme and the system is functioning satisfactorily.

The institute has installed gymnasium set-with modern appliances for physical exercises of the REDP trainees under a competent trainer. It adds a new feather to the well-built infrastructural set-up of the institution

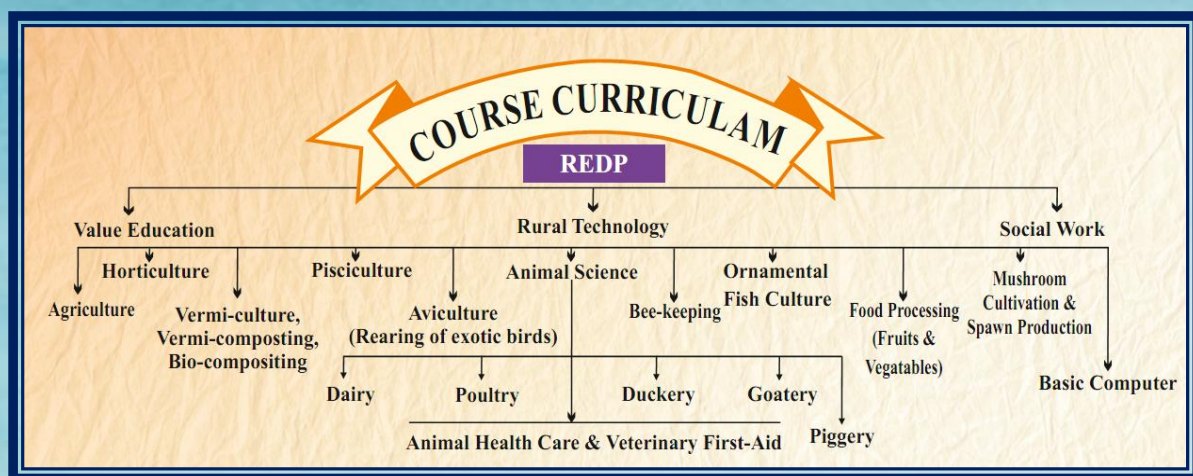

TRAINING COURSES

a) REDP (Rural Entrepreneurship Development Programme) the flagship training programme of the institute is being conducted uninterruptedly since 1986. This is a free residential comprehensive training of 10 months' duration (6 months for Agriculture & Allied Subjects, 4 months for Pashu Mitra under Animal Husbandry) given to 40 unemployed educated mail youth hailing from rural Bengal purely on the basis of merit irrespective of their caste, creed and religion. b) Apart from this programme, various short duration EDP and other in-campus & off-campus specified training courses on various trades under both farm & non-farm sectors are conducted. Detailed course programmes are categorised hereinafter.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The intending candidates are to apply against newspaper / website advertisement of the Institute. Those fulfilling the admission criterion are short listed for admission after written test & personal interview.

DAILY ROUTINE FOLLOWED IN THE INSTITUTE

The day starts at 5-00 am in the morning and ends at 10-00 pm. apparently, this is a rigorous schedule but made enjoyable through combination of training & reaaeration. Two times Prayer, in morning and evening, “Shramdan” for up-keeping the wide-spread campus clean and habitable, on-the-job training in the agricultural field adjoining the institute, physical exercise in the gymnasium, musical class, outdoor games – all these forms the essential fabric of the daily routine besides theoretical classes. With each passing day of the training course - the trainees feel a unique bond with the institute and they themselves voluntarily come forward at its every call even years after their passing out.

COURSE COVERAGE

Training disciplines, inter alia, include Agri-Horticultural practices, Sericulture, Poultry, Duck Rearing, Pisciculture & breeding including Ornamental Fish Cultivation, Animal Husbandry & Animal Health Care, Apiculture, Aviculture, Mushroom Cultivation & Spawn culture, Vermi-culture & Vermi-composting, Food Processing etc. along with Environment & Sanitation, Primary Health Care, Agricultural Extension, Entrepreneurship Development, Social Studies, Organisation Building, Basic Computer and Value education. Training curriculum includes both in-house training and field exposure. Apart from all these, the trainees are given lessons on importance of financial literacy, financial awareness and elementary Banking.



HIGHLIGHTS OF ACTIVITIES

SUBJECT SPECIFIC FOCUS :

AGRICULTURE

Agronomical crops, Agriculture with Soil Fertility & Soil Testing Procedure, Quality Seed Production, Integrated Plant Nutrient Management, Integrated Pest Management, Watershed Management etc.

HORTICULTURE

Fruit Crop, Pomology, Floriculture and Olericulture, horticultural nursery etc.



ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

Animal Husbandry and Animal Health Care including Dairy, Poultry, Duckery, Veterinary First-aid etc. are given due weightage considering their importance in rural economy and generation of self-employment.

FOOD PROCESSING

The Institute's training-cum-production unit on food processing is used for training on Processing and Preservation of fruits & vegetables (Various Types of Jam, Jelly, Pickles,

Squash, Tomato Ketchup, Chilli Sauce, Honey, Amlapras, Papad etc.). The unit is having state of the art machineries and appliances.

PISCICULTURE

Culture and captive breeding of freshwater Major Carps along with other fish species is on progress with a view to uplift the socio-economic status of rural sector. This venture includes a live demonstration pond and a fish hatchery unit, includes spawning and hatching pool with a collecting & race-way chamber. Induced breeding is also part of the curriculum.

ORNAMENTAL FISH CULTURE

Cultivation and multiplication of different types of Ornamental Fishes including its management practices have been incorporated in the course curriculum. This has emerged as a positive avenue of income generation for the trainees.



COMPOSTING (VERMI, BIO, SUPER ETC.)

The trainees are actively involved in preparation of Bio-Composting, which includes Super-Compost, Azolla, Vermicompost as-well-as preservation and multiplication of suitable species of earthworms by utilising the compost pits specially constructed for this purpose within the premises of the Institute. Different Bacterias are also used for composting.



AVICULTURE & CONSERVATION OF BIRDS (EXOTIC)

Keeping in view the emergence of Aviculture (rearing & breeding of exotic birds only) as an important field of entrepreneurship and also the importance of conservation of exotic birds, practical training along with theoretical classes are arranged in the Aviary and class room at the institute premises.



APICULTURE / BEE KEEPING

Honey-bees not only provide honey and wax but they also greatly contribute towards pollinating the insect-pollinated crops and thereby help in increasing agricultural production. Scientific Bee-keeping methodology in bee boxes along with its proper management round the year is being taught to the trainees to help them understand how Bees help the bee-keepers & the farmers.



MUSHROOM CULTIVATION

During the training period the trainees are taught about the cultivation and other management practices of different species of mushroom. With an object to providing quality mushroom spawn (seed) to the ex-trainees a laboratory for production of mushroom spawn has been established at the institute which effectively caters to the need of mushroom spawn of the ex-trainees in their start-up ventures on mushroom production.



DUCKERY

A Duckery unit is maintained inside the campus where 25 number of ducks of “Chara Chameli” & Khaki Campbell species have been reared.



POULTRY

The unit is enriched with the various varieties of birds received from farms owned by Government of West Bengal as gift. These birds are used for the purpose of Poultry training.



PIGGERY

Pig farming is a promoting venture to support the economic status, which has been included in the training course. The theoretical aspect is being dealt in-campus while practical is done in Haringhata Dairy Farm (Govt. of W.B) during their one month placement.



GOATERY

Goat farming is an important avenue to generate income. Theory and practical is done at Haringhata Dairy Farm despite detail theory at campus.

RABBIT FARMING

The farming on this aspect has been proved to be a profitable venture. As such farming of this animal has been set-up newly within this premises where offsprings are produced under proper management.

SELECTION & FORMAL INAUGURATION OF 39TH BATCH OF REDP COURSE

Selection camp for REDP (Rural Entrepreneurship Development Programme) Course **2024-25** was held on **4th & 5th May, 2024**. Out of **48** applicants, **36** candidates attended the camp and all of them were found to be eligible.

The **39th** session of the Rural Entrepreneurship Development Programme (REDP) of the institute started on **15th May 2024** with **35** candidates hailing from the rural areas of **14** districts of West Bengal. Formal inauguration was held on **8th June 2024**. The programme started with lighting of lamp (with Vedic Chanting) by Revered Swami Devarajanandaji Maharaj and other dignitaries. Welcome address was delivered by Swami Shivakarananda, Principal of the Institute and trainees were blessed and inspired by the speeches of Swami Shukadevananda, Secretary of Ramakrishna Mission Saradapitha. Dr Swapan Kumar Nandi, Retd. General Manager, UCO Bank and other dignitaries were present on the occasion and shared their thought through their speeches to the trainees. The programme ended with the benediction from Revered Swami Devarajanandaji Maharaj, Ramakrishna Math, Belur Math.

INSTITUTIONAL PLACEMENT/STUDY TOUR

During the period under review the trainees of the **38th** REDP batch were placed to different Govt. farms for undergoing hands-on training in various aspects of agriculture and allied activities like Induced Breeding of Fish, Dairy Management, Animal Health Care, Poultry, Piggery, Goat Rearing, Duck Rearing etc. as per the details given hereunder :

- a) Five day's fishery training camp from **August 05 – 09, 2024** at the Freshwater Fisheries Research and Training Centre (FFRTC), Kulia, Kalyani, Nadia where they underwent intensive field training on Induced Breeding of Fish, Seed Management and Ornamental Fish rearing.
- b) Six day's long training camp from **September 02 – 07, 2024** at Agricultural Training Centre (ATC), Chinsurah, Hooghly where they underwent intensive Agri-Horticultural training practices. This placement compensates to a large extent the absence of any agricultural farm at our campus.
- c) One month long training camp from **December 03, 2024** at Haringhata Farm, Kalyani, under Animal Resource Development Department, Govt. of West Bengal, where they were placed for intensive practical training on Dairy Management, Animal Health Care, Poultry, Piggery, Goatery, Duckery etc.



FIELD VISIT OF REDP TRAINEES

The trainees have undertaken field visit in the following institutions / farms:

a) Rice Research Station & Agriculture Training Centre, Chinsurah, Hooghly, b) Krishi Vigyan Kendra & Horticulture Garden at Chinsurah, Hooghly, c) Bidhan Chandra Krishi Viswavidyalaya, Mohanpur, Nadia, d) Krishi Vigyan Kendra at Bidhan Chandra Krishi Viswavidyalaya, Kalyani, Nadia, e) Model village at Gayeshpur, Nadia to study modern agricultural practices of the farmers, f) Sheep, Goat, Rabbit breeding farm, Govt. of West Bengal, Kalyani, Nadia, g) Soil testing laboratory and other activities of R K Mission, Pallimangal, Kamarpukur, h) Rural development units of Ramakrishna Mission Kamarpukur & Joyrambati, i) Poultry, Goat, Piggery & Dairy farm of West Bengal University of Fishery & Animal Science, Mohanpur, Nadia and j) Food processing unit at Chinsurah, Hooghly also.

REDP TRAINEES ROLE AS VOLUNTEER

For our REDP trainees Value Education is an important part of the course curriculum. Accordingly, the trainees actively took part as volunteer in all the important events held at Belur Math *e.g.* Shri Shri Durga Puja, Shri Shri Jagatdharthi Puja, Birthday Tithi Puja of Bhagawan Shri Ramakrishna Dev., Holy Mother Saradi Devi & Swami Vivekananda besides Annual Public Celebration following the Birthday Tithi Puja of Shri Ramakrishna Dev.



STUDY TOUR - VISIT TO PLACES OF HISTORICAL IMPORTANCE

From the very beginning of the REDP training course, the trainees were taken to Kamarpukur (Hooghly District), Jayrambati & Koalpara (Bankura District) to visit some places which are intimately associated with the secret memories of Sri Ramakrishna Dev and Holy Mother Sarada Devi. The trainees also visited the soil testing laboratory and observed some other activities of Pallimangal, the rural development units of Ramakrishna Mission Kamarpukur and Jayrambati.



35TH EX-TRAINEES CONFERENCE

The 35th Ex-trainees Conference was inaugurated at 9.30 a.m. on **March 15, 2025** by Swami Shukadevanandaji Maharaj, Secratery, Ramakrishna Mission Saradapitha at the **institute** premises. **86** numbers of ex-trainees of this institute and **30** numbers of visiting lecturers & other resource persons attended the conference and close interaction took place amongst the participants. Welcome address was delivered by Swami Shivakarananda, Principal of this Institute and ex-trainees were blessed through his motivational speech by Swami Vedatitananda, Correspondent, Ramakrishna Mission Shilpamandira. The programme ended with the benediction from Swami Shukadevanandaji Maharaj.

During the FY 2024-25, we organised 2 nos. of Residential Training Programme for Farmers and trained 61 trainees sponsored by Department of Agriculture, Govt. of West Bengal.

As per norms & methodology stipulated by the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), Govt. of India & NAR (National Academy of RUDSETI) there is various short duration training programme on Farm & Non-farm sector conducted within and outside the campus of the RSETI. In the FY 2024-25, we have conducted following training programmes – **Under Farm Sector** : Vegetable Nursery Management and Cultivation, Dairy Farming and Vermi-Compost Making, Poultry, Mushroom Cultivation, Goat Rearing, Krishi Udyami, Commercial Horticulture, Pashu Mitra etc. & **Under Non-farm Sector** : Women's Tailor (Ladies Tailoring), Beauty Parlor Management, Costume Jewelry Udyami, Jute Products Udyami, Soft Toys Maker and Seller, Fast Food Stall Udyami and Papad, Pickle & Masala Powder Making and trained **949** trainees. 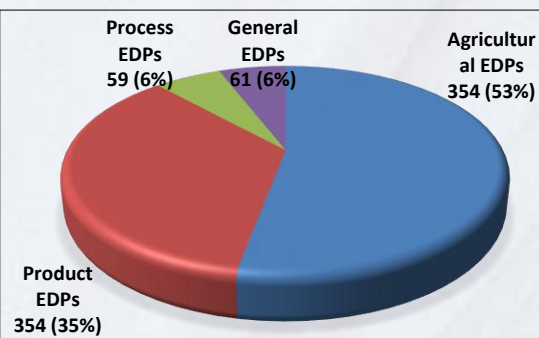

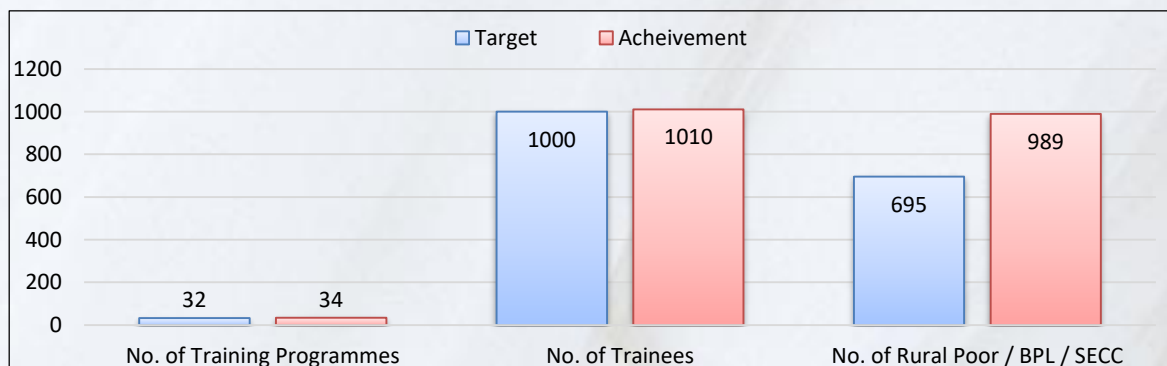

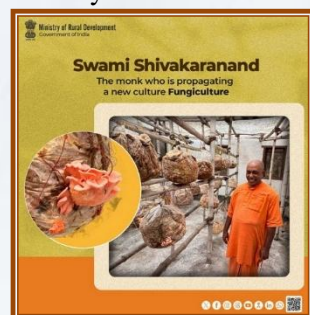
ANNUAL GRADING

VILLAGE ADOPTION PROGRAMME

Through more than 35 Sub-centres spread across twelve districts of West Bengal the institute is carrying on various types of educational and social activities. Primary School is run in most of our sub-centres for the benefit of the children living nearby. Free medical camp is functioning on specified days in the sub-centres. Stress is also laid on the preventive health care and sanitation. Villagers are made aware of the benefits of various immunisation & vaccination programmes of the government and local bodies. Our sub-centres are working towards empowerment of women, they are arranging various types of capacity building training programmes for the local women. Our sub-centres are helping in formation of Self Help Groups. Farmers are made aware of the improved methods of cultivation and advent of new technology. They are also made aware of the various welfare schemes of the government. Patha-chakra (religious discourse) is held in the evening on specified days at our sub-centres on regular basis. Our sub-centres also conduct relief measures in the form of providing shelter & food to the affected local people during natural disaster like cyclone, flood etc.



The institute has established a free coaching centre and a tube well for drinking water for the villagers located in and around Aharrah Vivekananda Yuba Sangha under Arsha block of Purulia district with the financial help of Ramakrishna Mission Saradapitha, Belur Math under community development scheme on the occasion of 125th Anniversary of the Foundation Day of Ramakrishna Mission. Free coaching centre is functioning smoothly. During the FY 2024-25, we have distributed 100 blankets amongst the poor villagers and Khata, Pen etc. to the students of coaching centres. We have also conducted 8 nos. of training programmes and trained 251 poor villagers on their skill development.

FINANCIAL LITERACY & CREDIT COUNSELING CENTRE (FLCC)

From the very beginning the FLC at Belur Math, formed under the sponsorship of erstwhile United Bank of India did a splendid job in implementing RBI's plan on Financial Inclusion. It spreads the message of financial literacy amongst cross section of the society. In all the RSETI training programmes we have kept a class on financial literacy.

POST-TRAINING SUPPORT SERVICE

Staying together for 10 months in a fully residential programme creates a very close bonding between the trainees and the institution. This makes regular interaction amongst the ex-trainees much easier. Ex-trainees love to maintain close contact with the Institute and this facilitates extending of all possible post-training support services to them. They visit the institute as and when required and consult the specialist faculties on different subjects regarding various problems encountered by them in implementing their projects. Conversely, the resource persons pay occasional visit to the project sites set up by the trainees. Close liaison with the ex-trainees result in better credit linkage with the banks since many veteran bankers render voluntary service at our institute.

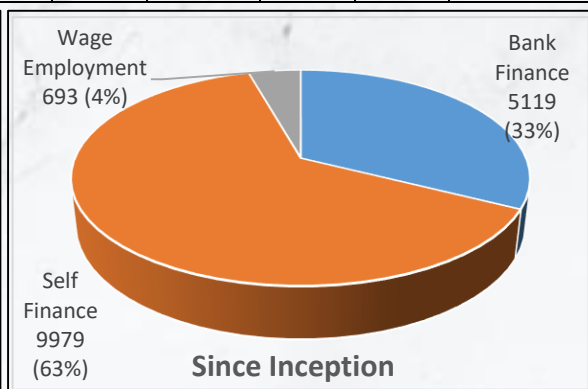
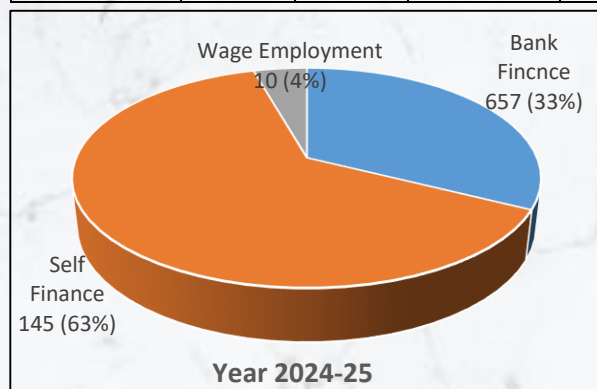
FOLLOW-UP

- Personal contact is being maintained with the ex-trainees to provide constant guidance to them in pursuing their vocation. The trainees are assisted in preparation of project proposals and filling of application forms for availing credit support from banks.
- During the FY under review, **1286** candidates under Agricultural EDPs, Products EDPs, Process EDPs and General EDPs were followed-up during **145** numbers of visits. Such hand holding continues for 2 years after the completion of training.
- Appendix-25 (format of quarterly report – post training evaluation) for the quarter ending **June 2024, September 2024, December 2024 & March 2025** was prepared and placed in the subsequent DLRAC meeting respectively.
- Follow-up programme has been further improved through MIS data base system.

SETTLEMENT DURING FY 2023-24

Out of the **812** number of trainees settled during the FY 2024-25, **145** trainees have set up their units with own funds, **657** trainees availed loans like KCC/SHGs/Others and another **10** trainees are presently employed in different organisations and rest yet to attain settlement. Name of Entrepreneur : Mrityunjoy Kuiri

Name of Training Programme : Poultry

Shri Mrityunjoy Kuiri is a young man of 24 years of age and hails from Arsha village under the district of Purulia, West Bengal. After completing graduation with Honors in History he was looking for some income generating opportunity. When he got the information through one of his friend that Aharrar Vivekananda Yuba Sangha, a sub-centre of Ramakrishna Mission Samaj Sevak Sikshan Mandir, Belur Math, Howrah is organizing a 20 days (80 hours) Skill Development Training Programme on Poultry farming from 03/09/2019 to 30/09/2019. Shri Kuiri readily enrolled himself in the programme. The traditional occupation of his family is cultivation and allied activities. Due to the soil condition and rainfall pattern only Aman paddy is cultivated in his area.

Due to the above geographical constraints his average annual income was paltry Rs.24000. Placed as such, he was trying to find some rewarding profession through which he can establish himself. Hence, he attended the RSETI training programme with all seriousness. He had some basic knowledge in the poultry farming and the training programme at the RSETI provided him the opportunity of honing his existing skill as well as acquiring the up-to-date knowledge and information on poultry farming.

During training he was found to be attentive and never hesitated in asking questions to remove his doubts. His interactions with the trainer and fellow trainees were found to be good.

The farm that he has built has a capacity of keeping 1200 birds at present. The chick suppliers give 15 days old birds and buyback the entire lot when it becomes 40/42 days old. His main challenge is rearing the birds to attain ideal weight and to keep them in healthy state. The feed, medicines etc. are supplied by the company. Maintaining proper sanitation is of utmost importance. Shri Kuiri has not engaged any part-time or full-time employee. He is being helped by his parents and brothers. He has invested around Rs.1,00,000/- and which he has arranged from his relatives & friends. Till date he has not applied for bank loan. He has been advised to avail the benefit of concessional rate of interest on money borrowed from PSU Banks for business expansion. His present monthly income varies between Rs.15,000/- to Rs.18,000/-. Shri Kuiri is still a bachelor and lives in a joint family comprising his parents, brothers and sisters.

Finding a steady source of the monthly income not only helped the Kuiri family economically it has improved their food habits, health condition, amenities at the dwelling place and also lifted the recognition level of the family in the society.

He has enough potentiality left in him and considering his will power & ambition he can be identified as an earging entrepreneur.

Name of the Entrepreneur : Shri Hemanta Sen
Name of Training : Mushroom Cultivation

Shri Hemanta Sen hails from a poor weaver family in rural Bengal. Due to the bad economic condition of his family he could not continue his studies in School and turned out to be a “Drop Out” after class-VII and started helping his father in the weaving job. But in today’s world a weaver owning a single loom and bereft of modern technology is destined to perish today or day after. But Shri Sen who took a Skill Development Training from Kotulpur Srima Sarvik Pallimangal, a sub-centre of our RSETI during the year 2022 showed huge self confidence and indomitable courage in fighting against adversities. The training he took was on Mushroom Cultivation and of 80 hours duration spread over 20 days.

Shri Sen is a man of strong common sense with practical approach. He could foresee the plight of weavers and never wasted time in finding settlement in life through an alternative channel. He gave full attention in the training class and tried his best in securing the essence of mushroom cultivation from the trainer. He had some rudimentary knowledge in the subject and the RSETI training provided an unique opportunity in gaining the latest technical knowledge and in doubt clearance.

During the busy season of mushroom production (September – March) his daily yield varies from 7 Kg to 10 Kg. Shri Sen is vending his produce from door to door at an average price of Rs.150/- per Kg. There is good demand for quality mushroom. But procuring of quality spawn remains a problem. Success of the venture depends largely on the quality of spawn cultivated in moist environment under moderate temperature.

Now, the average monthly income of Shri Sen is around Rs.30,000/-. This is definitely a quantum jump from his pre-training income of Rs.10,000/- per month. From weaving he was getting only Rs.200/- to Rs.250/- per sari and the rest from production & selling of mushroom on a very low scale. Now, in the mushroom cultivation he is ably assisted by his wife who also took a training on mushroom cultivation. Shri Sen had once applied for financial assistance from his banker some 2/3 years back but nothing tangible happened. He has invested Rs.1,00,000/- from his own source. He has been advised to approach his banker again with a fresh proposal. Shri Sen is endowed with a skill of gold ornament making and repairing from this also he earns a little.

Shri Hemanta Sen has overcome his lack of proper school education through his will power and resilience in conquering the obstacles of life. His search for self-reliance has almost materialized. He lives in a small happy family consisting his parents and two school going daughters. He has huge potential left in him and can be termed as a successful entrepreneur.

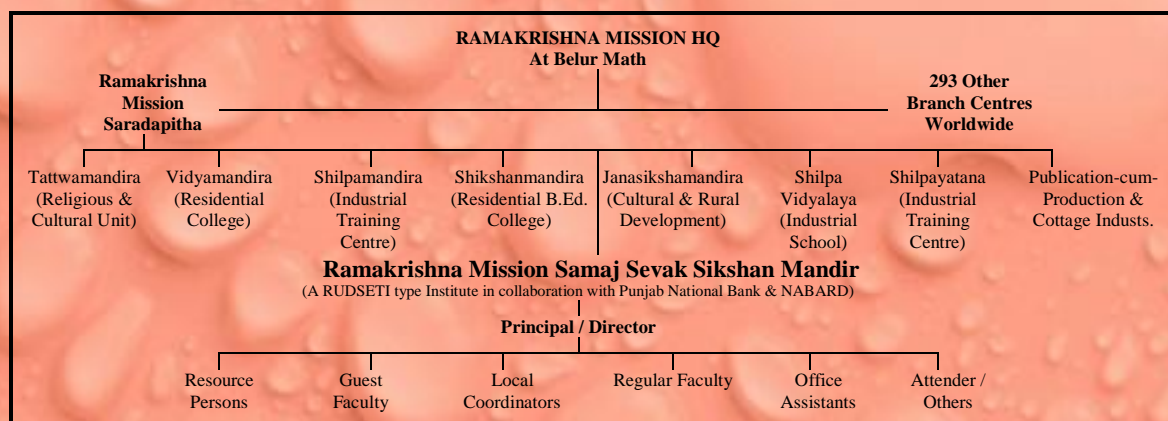
